ABOUT THE PROJECT

NTW collaborates with people and places to make powerful, brave theatre inspired by the experiences and stories of our nation. As Wales' English language theatre company, we bring people together to reimagine and push the boundaries of what theatre can and should be.

Through NTW TEAM we have broken new ground working inclusively with communities and theatre makers. By connecting people and creativity within their own localities and landscapes, we rethink the way work is made while creating transformative opportunities and experiences that deepen the impact and value of theatre.

This project is the culmination of over four years of NTW TEAM working in Wrexham. Based around principles of co-creation, our theme – chosen by the people of Wrexham – is homelessness/home. Our approach means that the voices of TEAM and our community partners will be present throughout the process.

The production will likely take place in multiple locations across Wrexham. We're exploring elements of game-theatre as well as working outdoors and in non-traditional theatre venues.

You're based in Wales, or were born and/or studied here. We think this role would particularly suit someone new to the industry or a recent graduate in this area.

- A proven ability to create and maintain positive working relationships with a Director and creative team
- Working knowledge of current Health & Safety practices
- Excellent communication skills
- An interest in prop making as well as sourcing.
